

## **NEW PICTURE BOOKS**

Thanks to the publishers who continue to send new picture books. I often say that very few authors can draw and very few illustrators can write – like Bob Graham, Pamela Allen or Alison Lester. But this batch includes a majority of books written and illustrated by the same person, and very well done too. I urge you to find them in your bookshop or library and share them with a child.

CARAVAN FRAN by Cheryl Orsini (Lothian). I had the pleasure of a visit from Cheryl when she was in the Blue Mountains visiting schools. This book, in rhyming text, tells the story of three friends on holiday and the unexpected adventure they have on their way to the sea. The illustrations have just enough detail to extend the story and continue the fun. Recommended.

THE COW TRIPPED OVER THE MOON by Tony Wilson & Laura Wood (Scholastic). This very amusing slant on 'The Cow Jumps Over the Moon' puts a whole new perspective on the cow's trip to the moon. After several unsuccessful attempts she finally makes it – 'Moon Attempt 8'. An imaginative extension of the original, written in easy to read, hilarious verse. Supported by colourful full-page illustrations, this book will be requested over and over and would even be fun for emerging readers, who will relate to the humour. Highly recommended.

FLIGHT by Nadia Wheatley & Armin Greder (Windy Hollow). The cover describes this as 'an ancient story becomes a fable for our times'. It begins with a man, his wife and baby, fleeing their home, following a star in seach of safe haven. They face deadly dangers but press on until they are safe, but among many other homeless refugees. The look of hope in the mother's and child's eyes on the last page leave the reader hoping as well. An extraordinary book by an award-winning author and illustrator. Highly recommended.

I WANNA BE A GREAT BIG DINOSAUR! by Heath McKenzie (Scholastic). Every boy is born loving dinosaurs. This playful and entertaining book has this boy wanting to **be** one. So he's shown the ropes by a big dinosaur who in the end reveals what he wants to be most of all. Fun to read and to share, with bold illustrations roaring across the pages. Recommended.

LARA OF NEWTOWN by Chris McKimmie (Allen & Unwin). It's a simple story of a stray cat looking for a place to call home, but in the hands of Chris McKimmie, it is witty and hilarious. The pages look chaotic but there's a definite pattern that requires close examination and several readings. The use of multiple

fonts and a mixture of hand-drawn, paint and collage completes the picture. Highly recommended.

THE MAN WITH THE MESSY HAIR by Pamela Allen (Penguin). Pamela Allen is a legend. This is her fiftieth picture book and it's just as good as previous books, many of which have won awards. It's very entertaining and perfect for reading aloud and even acting out. Highly recommended.

MY NAME IS LIZZIE FLYNN by Claire Saxby & Lizzy Newcomb (Walker). A well-written, poignant story recreating Lizzie Flynn's voyage to the penal colony in Australia. Lizzie can't sew, but she and other women learn and they make a quilt which has become known as 'The Rajah Quilt', now housed in the National Gallery in Canberra. The colourful acrylic illustrations graphically depict conditions on board the ship and a photograph of the actual quilt make this a useful book for schools and classroom discussion. Highly recommended.

PIG THE FIBBER by Aaron Blabey (Scholastic). Pig, the world's greediest pug is back, but this times he's telling whoppers. He blames all his misdeeds on poor Trevor. Finally he gets his comeuppance, and deservedly so. The colourful acrylic and pen and pencil illustrations and the eyecatching cover depict the mischievous pug perfectly. Highly recommended.

POSSUM MAGIC ACTIONS by Mem Fox & Julie Vivas (Omnibus). A board book for the very young based on the timeless classic *Possum Magic*. It's part of a series which includes *Numbers, Animals* and *Opposites*. A very good gift idea for a new baby. Recommended.

SHINE by Trace Balla (Allen & Unwin). This very touching story is about saying goodbye. Written from personal experience, it is a comforting reminder that loved ones never quite leave us. Balla's first book RIVERTIME is shortlisted in the 2015 CBCA awards. This second book is quite different but extremely special and beautifully illustrated. Highly recommended.

SHOULD YOU BE A RIVER by Ed Young (Little, Brown & Co). Not an Australian book but this is one of my favourite illustrators of all time. Ed Young is the illustrator of the beautiful SADAKO picture book I published years ago. This beautiful book is a personal poem celebrating the trials and triumphs of unconditional love. The brilliant illustrations use a mix of cut paper, photographs and calligraphy. Can you tell I'm a huge fan? Highly recommended.

TIME FOR BED, DADDY by Dave Hackett (UQP). There's always a new twist on bedtime and the trials of getting children into bed. This one of role reversal is warm, playful and appealing, published in time for Father's Day. Colourful cartoony illustrations (by Cartoon Dave) focus on the father and daughter and their pre-bedtime ritual. Recommended.
